

Alesea Stewardship Goals

- 1) Provide social and economic benefits to local communities.
- 2) Improve forest health and ecological function of late-successional forest.
- 3) Restore and maintain watershed function, connectivity and ecological diversity, including native plants, fish and wildlife habitat.
- 4) Manage road and trail system for improved water quality, hydrologic function and forest health while meeting the social, cultural and economic values of the community.
- 5) Promote soil productivity, water quality and sustainability of other resources.
- 6) Manage vegetation to improve composition, structure, condition, and health of stands, or to improve wildlife habitat or reduce fire hazards.
- 7) Control of invasive species and re-establish native species through natural re-colonization or active management (seeding, planting, release etc.).
- 8) Restore estuary and wetland function and processes.
- 9) Maintain and promote recreational uses that are compatible with watershed health.
- 10) Develop and conduct multi-party monitoring per Stewardship Authority.
